The Joy of Back to School



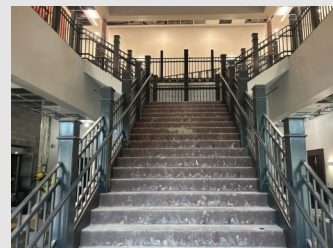

WATER RATES

The City of Auburn Water Rates are increasing. Here is a short breakdown of the increases:

Base Rate has increased from \$15 to \$16.50

Consumption rates has increased about 75 cents per each 1,000 Gallons used.

The average usage is close to 1,500 gallons per month.

The average family of 4 can expect to see their water bill increase by \$2 to \$3 per month. This may not seem like a lot, but it can add up over time. There are things that families can do to reduce their water usage and save money on their water bills, such as fixing leaks, watering their lawns less often, and taking shorter showers.



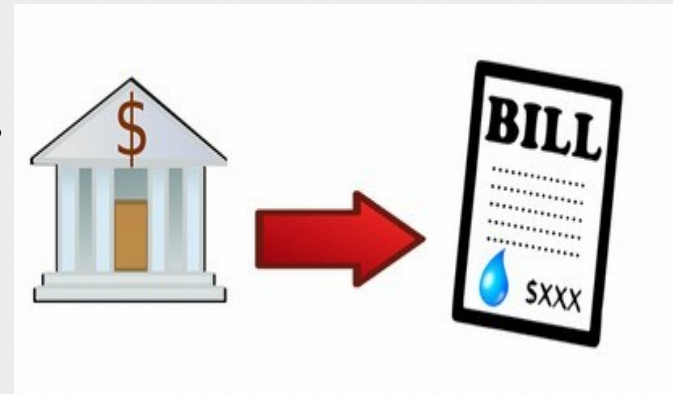

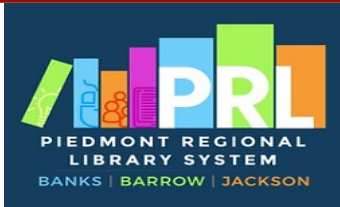
