Get Ready: Auburn's Municipal Election is Coming November 4

This November, Auburn residents will head to the polls for the municipal election—an important moment to help shape the city's leadership and future. Here's what you need to know, who's running, and how to make sure your vote counts.

What's on the Ballot

- City Council: Two seats are up for grabs. Voters will select two candidates to represent Auburn on the City Council.
- **Absentee Voting & Deadlines**: If you prefer to vote absentee, applications are accepted through **October 24, 2025**, at the Barrow County Elections Office.
- Advance Voting: Several early voting dates will be offered at the Barrow County Elections Office in Winder. Specific dates include October 14-17, October 20-24, and October 27-31, plus a Saturday on October 18, to provide convenient options ahead of Election Day.

Who's Running

Here are the candidates vying for Auburn's two Council seats:

- Taylor Sisk (Incumbent) seeking re-election and currently serving on the Council.
- Robert Vogel III (Incumbent) seeking re-election to continue on the Council.
- **Jonathan Eggleston** challenger.

Why It Matters

These elections aren't just about who sits on the Council—they influence how Auburn responds to issues like:

- Local infrastructure improvements
- Public safety and emergency services
- Zoning, planning, and neighborhood growth
- Budget priorities and city services

Who represents Auburn directly shapes how priorities are set, what projects are funded, and how the city plans for growth.

How to Participate

- Check voter registration well before the deadline. If you've moved, changed your name, or want to confirm you're ready to vote, verify your status.
- Make a plan: Decide if you're going in person, voting early, or requesting an absentee ballot. Mark the late-October advance voting dates.
- Learn about the candidates: Look for forums, interviews, or statements to see where each one stands on issues that affect you.
- **Share the word**: Encourage your neighbors, friends, and family to vote. Every vote matters in local elections.

As November draws near, it's the time for Auburn citizens to make their voices heard. Mark your calendar, get informed, and let's all show up to shape the future of our city.
